Niles, N.Y. – Over 900 surveys have been mailed to the residents and landowners of the Town of Niles in an effort to gather as much information as possible to include in the Town's first comprehensive plan. Each household should have received one copy of the survey in the mail. If other members in your household wish to participate, additional copies can be picked-up at the Town Hall. The survey was designed to take less than 10 minutes to complete and should be returned to the Town Hall (5923 New Hope Road, Moravia, NY) by **Friday, November 9, 2007**.

The Town of Niles is in the process of creating a comprehensive plan, which will be the foundation of Town policies regarding development and land use for the next 5 to 20 years. Your thoughts are needed as the Comprehensive Plan Committee moves ahead with the creation of the plan. Over the last 6 months the Committee has hosted a series of public visioning sessions to obtain public input on a variety of topics. The town-wide survey is another important way to obtain ideas and opinions from members of the community.
